# Year End Awards Program

Even though 2020 has been a crazy year, things are slowly starting to get back to normal. ENYDCTA will be offering Year End Awards this year with the following modifications to the rules:

- The volunteer requirement to be eligible for YEAP has been waived for this year.
- Only three scores are needed for ALL Dressage awards.
- Only two scores are needed for ALL Eventing awards.
- Recognized Dressage awards only need one score from the highest test of the level.
- The requirement for having dressage scores from two different shows and two different judges has been waived.
- Since all the local recognized dressage shows have been cancelled, there will be no Dressage Show Series award this year.
- Scores from the ENYDCTA virtual shows can be used for schooling show awards. You need to submit a copy of the test with the score and signature of the judge.
- There is a new category for Junior IEA participants. This will be an overall award, not split by level. Submit three test scores. Equitation scores will not count.

Due to the shutdown, the dates for eligible scores has changed. Scores earned from 12/1/2019 – 3/16/2020 and

7/1/2020 – 11/30/2020 may be used. Scores earned from 3/17/2020 – 6/30/2020 are not eligible. This is reflective of the time from when the USEF suspended competitions through the date that New York state started allowing competitions again.

The changes announced at the beginning of the year are still in effect. The Dressage Schooling Show 2 nd level division has been expanded to 2nd level - Grand Prix, to account for Test of Choice classes. The Eventing Schooling Show Novice level division has been expanded to Novice – Advanced levels. All scores for both divisions must be from the same level. There is now an Open division for Schooling Show Awards for both Eventing and Dressage. This will be its own, over-

all category and will not be combined with the other AA/Jr levels. Professional riders are eligible to compete in this category at any level. The division will not be split by level unless there are more than 10 entries.

Awards include:

- USEF Recognized Dressage Awards - Training Level through FEI
- USEF Recognized Dressage Freestyle Awards - Training Level through FEI
- USEF Recognized Eventing Awards - Beginner Novice through Advanced
- Dressage & Eventing Schooling Show Awards
- Western Dressage – Intro through Level 3
- Working Equitation Awards Children's – Level 7/ Masters
- Masters Awards (rider must be 50 years of age or older) – Dressage, Eventing, and Working Equitation
- Adult Amateur and Junior Championships – Dressage, Eventing, and Working Equitation
- Rider Achievement Awards – Dressage, Western Dressage, Eventing & Working Equitation
- Horse of the Year – Dressage, Western Dressage, Eventing, and Two Phase
- Eventing Show Series Awards

Entries must be received by the closing date which is 12/7/2020. Awards will be announced in January. Arrangements can be made to pick up awards or they can be shipped. Shipping in groups of two or more people will be done at no charge. Shipping individual awards will still have an \$8 fee.

# Scholarship Recap by Josie DeChaine

In March of this year I was lucky enough to be awarded the 2020 ENYDCTA Junior Scholarship. I applied for this scholarship with the hopes of attending a Lendon Gray clinic at the end of April.

Through Dressage4Kids, Lendon Gray hosts Training, Education And Mentoring, aka "TEAM" clinics throughout the country. Young riders from all over apply to be part of the TEAM program, which enables you to receive informative emails, opportunities, scholarships and attend clinics.

Shortly after I was granted this scholarship, our world changed. I wasn't sure when I would be able to leave my house, let alone go to a clinic and ride with other riders. After months of waiting, in June Lendon Gray was able to teach a clinic at Blue Ribbon Farm in Clinton Corners, NY. Lisa Herman was gracious enough to let us into her beautiful facility to have a safe, fun clinic.

The day before we left, I started to get nervous. I had never been to a clinic before! I also was aboard Darshan HM, affectionately known as Dash. Dash came to our barn in March and I had only been consistently riding him for 3 months when it came time to ride with Lendon. We already had a bond, but he's a big guy! An 11 year old, 17hh Hanovarian with big movement is much different from what I had been riding up until then. Sometimes he gets fresh at home and I wasn't sure what to expect of him off property.

We arrived at Blue Ribbon Farm around 7am on June 26th. The entire property was gorgeous! I unloaded my things and then showed Dash to his temporary living quarters. I think Dash thought he was at a Five-Star hotel! He spent his day in the back of the stall, head out the

window, admiring the surroundings.

After a morning of watching wonderful lessons with Lendon Gray, we got our first lecture of the day. Molly Maloney of MM Dressage gave us a great talk on young horses and bringing them up the levels. Something I really took away from Molly's talk was that young horses aren't for everyone. She emphasizes realizing that if the responsibility of a baby is something you're ready for and not feeling any shame in sending your young horse to a professional for initial training.

After Molly, it was time for me to start getting ready. I groomed Dash and braided his mane. I also did his fancy white polo wraps. Lendon stresses the importance of doing things yourself. She will look over your wraps and braids and tell you what's good and what you should change. Spoiler alert, she requested that I perfect them the next day.

I longed Dash before mounting just in case he had any extra energy to get out. He just walked around on the line, calm as can be. I mounted, went into the arena, and started my 45 minute lesson.

Lendon and I went over my SMART (Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Realistic, Timely) goal sheet I had to previously hand in. I was working on leg yielding straight with Dash and that is what I was looking to work on that day. I probably did 50 leg yields that afternoon! Once I got a good one, we stopped. That is something I think is important- not pushing for more after you've achieved it.

I'm not going to lie, my first day ended in tears. I had a great lesson and learned so much, but I was overall upset with myself and how I rode. I knew I could be a much better rider and make Dash move and respond better than he did. I decided to go into the next lesson with a different mindset. One lesson does not define what progress I had made thus far, one lesson can't showcase how far we've come from three short months earlier.

After feeding Dash dinner and listening to a lecture from Lendon, we loaded Dash back up and headed home for the night so our farrier could repair Dash's shoe. (Did I mention he's a nightmare to keep shoes on?)

Unfortunately, if you know my trainer well, you know she gets lost in a paper bag without her GPS and we were a little too close to the Taconic Parkway with our rig for comfort! For those of you not in the area, commercial trucks and trailers are definitely not allowed on the Parkway. So that was a fun adventure but we did get home eventually and Jesse repaired Dash's shoe at 9pm. Everybody remember to appreciate your farrier! No hoof, no horse!

The next day, we arrived bright and early the next morn-







ing with a new approach to the day and proper written-out-on-paper directions. After a morning lecture from Lendon about the Training Pyramid, we started lessons. Lendon has everyone watch all the lessons you can, which is wonderful. You learn so much from observation and listening. She is very horse-rider specific, too. I tried to apply some things I heard her say to other riders that she immediately told me not to do. Lendon said I was probably the first person she's said, "Get his head up" to! Every horse needs something different.

My second lesson went a lot better in my opinion. I felt that I rode better and was able to get Dash to go more the way I know he normally does. The second day, Lendon had each rider tell her what they wanted to do that day. I worked on bending Dash throughout his body instead of just his neck. Lendon is a big "don't make the same mistake twice" kind of person. There were a few moments I had him way overbent, which was ok

because it was different from what I was doing originally and Lendon said "Too bent! I love it!!" We also worked on Dash using his hind end and carrying his own weight instead of trying to hang on me and have my hands hold him up. We used what she called a bump, where I quickly interrupted his pulling down by flicking my wrist up. I had to remind myself not to hang on him while he pulls on me.

I missed the next lecture since I was the ride before it, but it was a lecture over Zoom about stretching yourself out before and after riding and breathing techniques given by Kelly Mahoney. After lessons finished, we thanked everyone and said goodbye and were on our way home. We even got a photoshopped photo of us all together even though we had to take single pictures because of social distancing. Lendon made sure we all wrote short thank you notes to everyone involved in putting this program on.

Overall, my experience at the Dressage4Kids TEAM clinic was one that I will always remember. She gave me a lot of insight and tips that I have used in my everyday riding since.

Thank you to everyone who helped make this TEAM clinic possible while keeping it safe for everyone! To my fellow riders under 21, everyone should look into what Dressage4Kids has to offer.

A big thank you to my wonderful trainer who gave up two days of work to trailer and come coach and support Dash and me. We wouldn't be where we are without you!

Also a huge thank you to Dash's owner for letting me advance my riding by letting me work with him. Most importantly, thank you ENYDCTA for the scholarship this year. Without it, I would not have been able to attend this incredible clinic. I encourage everyone to apply for ENYDCTA's scholarship program going forward! Thank you again, ENYDCTA!



# Scholarships

ENYDCTA will offer three scholarship opportunities to its members for the 2020-2021 season.

After careful consideration from the Scholarship Selection Committee, recipients will be announced at the 2020 Annual Meeting. These scholarship funds are designed to help our membership attend clinics and work with trainers they otherwise would not have the opportunity to.

**ENYDCTA Adult Scholarships:** ENYDCTA offers two separate adult scholarships in the amount of \$500 each. Applicants must meet the criteria indicated on the application.

**ENYDCTA Junior/Young Rider Scholarship:** ENYDCTA offers one junior/young rider scholarship each year in the amount of \$250. Members under the age of 21 qualify as being a young rider/junior member. Applicants must meet the criteria indicated on the application.

*\*AA as defined by USEF & USDF General Scholarship*

## Guidelines

1. Applications for ENYDCTA Scholarships are open to all ENYDCTA members as determined by the specific criteria for each scholarship. Applications have a firm deadline of November 1. No late applications will be accepted.
2. To apply for a scholarship, fill out the application cover form (available at enydcta.com) and submit it with the required materials/documentation. An application cover form must be submitted with each scholarship application.
3. Each year a committee of at least three people will review the applications and make their selections. The committee is carefully selected by the board to ensure a non-biased evaluation of applicants.
4. Each scholarship applicant is rated on the information provided with an emphasis on service to ENYDCTA (volunteering, etc.) and how this experience relates to your goals and future plans. Applicants not documenting sufficient experience will be determined ineligible for the current year. Please do not assume that the scholarship committee is aware of the details of your involvement with the club. Please note the specific criteria to be met are listed within the Application Details.
5. ENYDCTA scholarships cannot be used for professional training of your horse or to supplement

show fees for a professional rider to ride your horse or extraneous expenses such as trailering, gas, food, tack, etc.

6. Applicants may only receive one scholarship per year and must meet new requirements before applying again. There will be a three-year waiting period for recipients of an ENYDCTA scholarship to reapply. Applicants not awarded a scholarship are eligible to apply again.
7. Scholarship monies will be disbursed when a voucher is submitted as reimbursement for approved services/functions as detailed within the scholarships' specific guidelines and application. Each recipient will be asked to write a brief article about how they utilized scholarship funds and the experience they gained to be published in the Piaffe Flyer.
8. Scholarships will be used for the designated term from November 1, 2020 to October 31, 2021.
